The BLMK ICB Covert Administration Guidance (Adults) contains the following appendices which can be accessed via the Ardens 'Covert Medication Administration' template:





Ardens 'Covert Medication Administration' template:



Select document to complete then create as 'New letter' by clicking on 'Write now'





Sending documents to care home via secure NHS email:

Completed documents such as the MCA assessment and Best Interests decision forms can be emailed to the care home via secure NHS net email by right clicking on the letter in the tabbed journal and selecting 'Send via NHSmail' (as below).

Practices can save NHS email addresses for their aligned care homes in their own 'Address book' in the 'Organisation Contacts' tab.



You will be asked to confirm whether you would still like to send the email to the named care home and NHS mail address (as below)



A brief email can be composed (see below), and the completed document will be attached. This will be sent directly to the care home NHS mail address once the patients record is saved. The document can be viewed in the patient record for future reference.

Please note: other documentation (e.g., Best Interests decision form) would need to be completed and sent as a separate document.
