Adhesive Removers Sprays	Sprays are more cost effective than wipes. Generally, prescribe one type but might need occasional both spray/wipes as directed by stoma nurse.		
	StoCare Remove 50ml /100ml Ostofliff Clinipeel Offmore	STC100 /300 300724 4501 OM60	2 bottles per 30 stoma bags Multiple stomas will need double amount
Adhesive Remover Wipes	Wipes may be more suitable for people with poor dexterity or two-piece stoma bags.		
	StoCare wipes (1 st line) Salts wipes (2 nd line)	STC 200 WAP	1 single wipe per pouch (1 box per 30 pouches)
Barrier Wipes (films, foams)	Short-term use only via Clinical Nurse Specialist (usually 3 months) All barrier preparations are on specialist advice.		
	Stocare wipes Independence Fusion (on specialist advice only)	STC 250 BW3	30 Wipes for every 30 stoma bags
Barrier Sprays	For peri-anal soreness, anal dilation soreness, peristomal breakdown.		
	Clinifilm Stocare Respond Clinishield	300719 STC 150 RMC 5 3831	1 bottle per 30 stoma bags
Other Barriers e.g. creams	For mucocutaneous hypersensitivity, Cancer patients & complex dermatological conditions.		
	Medi Derma-S Barrier Cream 90g Pelican Barrier cream 60g Clinimed Barrier cream LBF	60345 130100E 3821	On specialist nurse advice only
Discharge Solidifying gels	Sometimes described as thickening gels. Consider second and third line in patients with chemotherapy induced diarrhoea, jejunostomy		
	Gel X caps Esenta Diamond Sachets Absorb Neutralising sachets	GEL-X TR105 PFW6	1 box per 30 stoma bags.

Irrigation Kits accessories	Complete kits provided by Trust Stoma nurses. Prescription service to prescribe replacement accessories.		
	Coloplast including accessories Dansac including accessories		These should last up to a year.
Lubricating gels	Lubricating deodorising gels via clinical nurse specialist, these are used as a lubricant, not deodoriser as they help to reduce pancaking. The ICB does not support the prescribing of the sachets.		
	Glide Odour Neutralising Lubricant Brava lubricating Bottle	TCB6 12061	1 bottle lasts approximately 3 months
Seals / Barrier Rings	These are mouldable and help prevent leaks. Check to see if still needed before issuing a repeat prescription		
	Eakin Brava Adapt (including CERA)	ALL codes ALL codes ALL codes	30 per month i.e. one per stoma bag

	Respond powder 50g	ABP2	As per Specialist recommendation from Stoma Team
Stoma Paste	Pastes are used to create an even surface immediately next to the stoma this gives a good seal and helps to prevent leakages.		
	Salts Dansac Soft Paste	NSP1 77550-0	As per Specialist recommendation from Stoma Team
Support Wear	Levels 2- 3 belts and vests are supported by the ICB. These should only be prescribed following an assessment by Clinical Nurse Specialist.		
	All Brands		Maximum 3 per year

	Brava Elastic Tape Salts Comfort Flange extender Hollister	ALL codes ALL codes ALL codes 79402	Up to 3 per stoma bag depending on size (Patient Specific)
Ileostomy bags	The ICB does not support the prescribing of flushable bags		
	Drainable bags		30 bags per month
Colostomy bags	The ICB does not support the prescribing of flushable bags		
	Non-drainable bags (Closed bags)		Up to 90 bags per month

Urostomy bags	The ICB does not support the prescribing of flushable bags	
	These are drainable & will need matching to manufacturer's night drainage bags (see below)	20-30 bags per month
Night drainage bags	This information is relevant for urostomy patients not continence	
	Matching Manufacturers (see above)	5 bags per month.
