All ASC staff involved in medication should complete the following eLearning courses, appropriate to their care setting:

### Care Home Staff (Nursing, Residential, Learning Disability)

The following courses have been purchased by the ICB, therefore **access is free** for adult social care staff across BLMK (using the access codes below). The courses support the implementation of recommendations in the [NICE guideline SC1 \(Managing medicines in care homes\)](#) and carry a NICE endorsement statement. The courses meet the requirements for training of care home staff who administer or assist with the administration of medication.

<a href="#">Medicines use in care homes: course 1</a>	<p>This course covers: Safe use of medicines, medicines basics, Medicines Administration Records, general principles of medicines administration, the monthly medicines cycle and self administration, as well as administration of PRN medicines, solid doses, liquids, inhalers, topical products, transdermal patches and eye drops. (Approx. time 5 hours – can be completed in stages.)</p> <p>Access to a shorter <a href="#">annual update</a> version of the course is included and can be completed on a yearly basis to refresh knowledge.</p> <p><b>Access code: 904ecad71cc2dafddeed048e9b4c204f</b></p>
<a href="#">Medicines use in care homes: course 2</a>	<p>This course covers: missed and delayed doses, covert administration, the management of controlled drugs in care homes, homely remedies and self-care, medicines reconciliation and effective management of medicine supplies in care homes. (Approx. time 3.5 hours – can be completed in stages.)</p> <p><b>Access code: a1f61452b8784c7b43fcaffcfa32b6ca</b></p>
<a href="#">Medicines use in care homes: course 3</a>	<p>This course covers: medicines and falls risk, antipsychotic medicines in dementia, administration of oral anticoagulants, administration of methotrexate and other cytotoxic medicines, administration of bisphosphonates and the administration of medicines used in Parkinson's disease. (Approx. time 3 hours – can be completed in stages.)</p> <p><b>Access code: oyqlt6xpkltay1qmuxydgzcy41slx40</b></p>
